School of Dentistry

The UQ School of Dentistry has a long and proud tradition of 81 years of strength in dental education and research and attracts high achieving students nationally and internationally. UQ is a leading source of expertise in the local, national, and international dental community and has been a key contributor to achieving effective solutions to contemporary issues and challenges. The School has strong collaborations within and outside the dental profession.

As part of the Faculty of Health and Behavioural Sciences, the School of Dentistry offers the Bachelor of Dental Science (Honours) program and specialist post-graduate programs (Doctor of Clinical Dentistry) and in 2023 the Doctor of Dental Medicine. The School of Dentistry also has a growing cohort of research higher degree students. Research within the School is focused on a number of themes and crosses a range of areas from laboratory-based research through to technologies applied in clinical practice and dental public health.

The Oral Health Centre (OHC)

The OHC opened in January 2015. This award-winning building is the largest and best equipped facility for patient treatment, dental education, and research in Australasia. The OHC has over 150 chairs across 11 clinics and 2 general anaesthetic theatres, a PC2 laboratory catering to a range of laboratory-based research, 2 clinical simulation laboratories, 2 auditoriums and a seminar room complex.

The OHC's location on the Herston campus provides an excellent interface with other disciplines and health services, with the nearby Royal Brisbane & Women's Hospital, the UQ Faculty of Medicine and School of Public Health, and the UQ Centre for Clinical Research. New teaching and research facilities (including expanded simulation labs) and new equipment at the forefront of current technology used in dentistry have allowed the School of Dentistry to commence a refreshed and innovative undergraduate dental program, along with an expanded range of postgraduate programs.

The Oral Health Alliance (OHA)

From January 2017, the OHA integrated the activities of Metro North Hospital and Health Service Oral Health Services and the UQ School of Dentistry to establish world-class activities in clinical teaching, research and service provision in oral health, headquartered around the state-of-the-art Oral Health Centre on the co-located Royal Brisbane and Women's Hospital and UQ campus at Herston.

At this level the successful candidate is expected to demonstrate outstanding outcomes in leadership roles and have an exceptional record of leading specialist orthodontics training programs and supervising Higher Degree by Research (PhD) students successfully to completion as principal supervisor. This role is being offered at Academic Level D/E as either a Teaching and Research Academic position or a Clinical Academic position.

Duties

Teaching

- Carry out teaching for undergraduate, postgraduate and/or professional entry level students, including coordinating courses, preparing and delivering lectures and tutorials, and undertaking assessment and marking.
- Take a leadership role in clinical program development.
- Lead the ongoing improvement and development of Orthodontics undergraduate and postgraduate programs and/or a significant contribution to the development and/or coordination of teaching to ensure courses are engaging, relevant and contemporary.
- · Lead educational practice and innovative curriculum design.
- Act as Principal Supervisor to Higher Degree by Research students.
- Maintain and improve the quality of courses as measured through evaluation instruments to meet industry and educational standards.
- Provide high quality service to students, including academic counselling and advice.
- Understand and apply University Rules relevant to teaching and learning practice.

Research

- Undertake research that is recognised internationally for its outstanding impact on policy, practices in Orthodontics research.
- Lead significant and strategic research agendas that yield new insights and its beneficial application
- Maintain a record of international recognition and leadership in Orthodontics, producing
 quality research outputs by publishing in high quality national and international research
 journals, other appropriate refereed publications and conference publications.
- Initiate and lead funding initiatives and applications as chief investigator role in applications
 for significant research funding to support projects and activities, which includes actively
 seeking, obtaining and managing research funding.

 to represent and promote the discipline area in leading academic and research forums.
- Drive the development of opportunities for the application of knowledge beyond the specific research area to create an environment of cross collaboration between disciplines.
- Leads and achieve transfer of knowledge, technology and practices to research end users through translation, including commercialisation of UQ Intellectual Property.
- Hold leadership roles in discipline service, including service on prestigious editorial boards, or other discipline leadership positions, or national and international committees.

- Act as Principal Supervisor to Higher Degree by Research and professional entry level students.
- Demonstrates and leads others in the responsible conduct of research.

- · Lead the facilitation of engagement opportunities for supervisees
- Effectively lead and develop supervisee performance and conduct by providing feedback, coaching, and professional development.
- Manage staff effectively throughout the employee lifecycle in accordance with University policy and procedures.
- Working to promptly resolve conflict and grievances when they arise in accordance with University policy and procedures.

Communicates and collaborates with influence


Leaders engage others in open and honest dialogue about important issues and actively seek common interests and goals.
